



The Greg Suhr 2017 Scholarship Application

BACKGROUND:

In recognition of and gratitude for Greg Suhr's service to San Francisco as its Police Chief and in other civic roles, a diverse group of Bay Area business and civic leaders has created the Greg Suhr College Scholarship Fund.

The purpose of the Fund is to provide college tuition/cost assistance to deserving San Francisco youth who lack sufficient resources of their own for such purposes. Monies from the Fund will be given to San Francisco youth service organizations selected by Chief Suhr for use by them in making actual scholarship awards to individual participants in their youth programs.

ELIGIBLE RECIPIENTS:

Award recipients will be San Francisco residents of strong character with a demonstrated ability to succeed in a core college curriculum, but who lack financial resources. Awards will be for up to \$1000/year, may be renewed for subsequent years upon satisfactory performance during a prior award year and will be made by the sponsoring youth agency based on these contemplated qualifications and others that the agency may require.

Awards will be made for as long as Fund assets permit.

REFERRAL PROCESS:

Eligible youth must be referred by Deputy Probation Officers, Juvenile Hall Counselors, Log Cabin Ranch Counselors, Social Workers, CASA workers, attorneys or other youth advocates. Referrals will be screened by City Youth Now and one recipient will be selected.

Applications must be received in the City Youth Now office by 5:00 p.m. March 22, 2017.
