This program is designed to provide flexible and direct funding for juvenile justice-involved young people and their families to ensure participants and their whole families gain or maintain access to basic needs including childcare, food, water, clothing, technology, internet access, transportation, educational vouchers, legal services, and more. Family and youth needs must be addressed for a youth to thrive. This program focuses on individualized resource access and barrier removal support to address unmet areas of need. Interview with a YPEE Youth



What were your goals when you started the internship?

S: I came in with an open mind I just knew that whatever I was gonna do, I had to do it to the best of my ability. (...) I really enjoyed my time here [at my site]. I built a couple bonds here with the staff and kids.



Has the internship given you any ideas on the kind of work you'd like to do after the program or in the future?

S: I've enjoyed working here. I wouldn't be mad to continue working here. I don't see it as a job, it's more like hanging out with my little siblings or little cousins. It's really perfect for me. I am really energetic, a ball of energy, and so are the kids. I feel like I am a big brother.



Is there anything you would like to share with anyone considering the program?

S: I would say go in with an open mind. There are plenty of options (...) all of them are very beneficial because you are going to learn a lot of useful information, not only for the workplace, but for your life. You learn a lot of useful tools and meet a lot of good people, cool people, and build connections that help you in your current state and future.
